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MSC Travel Bursary Terms & Conditions

Menno Simons College offers bursaries of up to \$300 each to assist with the cost of travel for students planning to attend CRS and/or IDS related conferences held outside of Winnipeg. Students are limited to one travel bursary per academic year.

- **MCC UN Fall Student Seminar**
- **Other** – Students may choose to attend a different IDS/CRS related conference. In this case, the student must submit a proposal to the Chair of the MSC Scholarships and Bursaries Committee with their application, outlining relevant details of the conference and how the student believes it connects with his or her IDS/CRS class(es) or degree.

Terms and Conditions:

1. All documents must be submitted to MSC by the deadlines provided.
2. To be eligible, a student must have:
 - a) completed a minimum of 6 credit hours of IDS-1200 or CRS-1200;
 - b) declared a major or minor in IDS and/or CRS; and
 - c) a minimum GPA of 3.0.
3. Bursaries will be granted on an individual basis; the student's GPA, strength of the written essay, the relevance of the conference to IDS and/or CRS, the student's community involvements, and the student's level of involvement within the conference are all taken into account.
4. Funds will not be made available to the bursary recipient until MSC receives confirmation of the student's registration in the specified conference, as well as a signed liability waiver form (provided by MSC). Upon return, the bursary recipient must also provide proof of travel (e.g. travel ticket, fuel receipts).
5. By accepting the bursary, the student commits to submitting a one-page written report of the conference to the Chair of the MSC Scholarships and Bursaries Committee. The written report should outline the student's overall experience and participation at the conference, what they learned, what they found valuable, etc. *This report will be submitted no later than one month after the conference dates.* (An alternative project may be arranged with permission of the Chair of the MSC Scholarships and Bursaries Committee.)

The purpose of this bursary program is to encourage and support the capacity for student leadership in issues related to IDS and/or CRS.

NOTE: All non-academic bursaries are subject to available funds during a given academic year¹.

¹ An academic year begins in September and ends in August.
