1) International Student Scholarship (up to \$1500)

- international student currently studying on a student visa

2) Ivan Esau Leadership Scholarship (up to \$1300)

- exceptional academic record
- proven leadership qualities (please outline in essay)
- you must submit TWO letters of reference; at least one of these references must be from an MSC faculty member

NOTE: *To honour the intention of the donor to develop leaders in the Mennonite community, at least one scholarship will be awarded to an active member of a Mennonite church (however, all students are encouraged to apply). If you are applying for this scholarship and are an active member of a Mennonite church, write the name of the church here:*

3) Margarita Esau Achievement Scholarship (up to \$700)

- strong academic record
- proven leadership qualities (please outline in essay)

4) Dr. J.E. Isaac Scholarship (up to \$1000)

- awarded to students of MSC on the basis of academic merit

5) Dr. Bernie and Marge Wiebe Scholarship (\$300)

- strong academic achievement
- leadership in addressing conflict, inequality and poverty (please outline in essay)

6) Isaac and Margaret Redekop Scholarship (\$300)

- strong academic record
- proven leadership qualities (please outline in essay)

7) Gisela Saborowski Memorial Scholarship (\$1000)

- strong academic record
- completed, at minimum, 60 credit hours
- active involvement as a volunteer in community agencies (please outline in essay)

NOTE: *To honour the intention of the donor, the award will be given to an individual who has overcome challenges in pursuit of his/her education (please outline in essay).*

8) Elizabeth Buckland Memorial Scholarship (\$1000)

- completed, at minimum, *International Development Studies* or *Introduction to Conflict Resolution Studies* with a minimum 'B' final grade AND declared a major in Conflict Resolution or International Development Studies
- be of Indigenous Identity (self-declared on U of Winnipeg application) or Newcomer Canadian (from a developing country within the last 5 years)
- submit an essay of 500 words outlining proven leadership qualities

NOTE: *To honour the intention of the donor, the award will be given to an individual who identifies as Indigenous or Newcomer Canadian and recognizes the potential of education to overcome particular challenges.*

9) Menno Simons College Student Association (MSCSA) Scholarship (up to \$500)

- be aligned with the values of the MSCSA, including principles of peace, justice, equality, social action, and community
- be enrolled in a minimum of two *Conflict Resolution Studies* and/or *International Development Studies* courses in an academic year
