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MSC Local Learning Bursary Terms & Conditions

Menno Simons College is offering bursaries to cover 50% of registration fees, up to a maximum of \$100, for full-time students planning to attend CRS and IDS related learning events held in Winnipeg or Southern Manitoba. Students are limited to one local learning bursary per academic year.

Students applying for this local learning bursary must submit their application, including a summary and recent grade report, to the Chair of the MSC Scholarships & Bursaries Committee. This summary should include relevant details about the local learning event and how the student believes it connects with their IDS/CRS class(es) or degree.

Terms and Conditions:

1. All documents must be submitted to MSC by the deadlines provided.
2. Eligibility: Students must have:
 - a) completed at least 6 credit hours of IDS-1200 or CRS-1200;
 - b) declared a major or minor in IDS or CRS; and
 - c) a minimum GPA of 3.0.
3. Students are **not** eligible for this bursary if they are receiving academic credit for this learning event. (Students receiving academic credit may speak to the MSC Academic Advisor for more information on academic scholarships and bursaries.)
4. Bursaries will be granted on an individual basis; the student's GPA, strength of written summary, relevance of the local learning event to IDS and/or CRS, community involvements, and the student's involvement level within the local learning event are all taken into account.
5. Funds will not be made available to the bursary recipient until MSC receives confirmation of the student's registration in the specified conference.
6. By accepting the bursary, the student commits to submitting a one page written report of the learning event to the Chair of the MSC Scholarships & Bursaries Committee. The written report should outline the students' overall experience and participation at the learning event, what they learned, what they found valuable, etc. *This report will be submitted no later than one month after the event dates.*
(An alternative project may be arranged in consultation with the Chair of the MSC Scholarships & Bursaries Committee.)

The purpose of this bursary program is to encourage and support student leadership capacity in issues related to IDS and CRS.

NOTE: All non-academic bursaries are subject to available funds during a given academic year¹.

¹ An academic year begins in September and ends in August.
