



MENNO SIMONS COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

Entrance Scholarships:

- 1) **International Student Scholarship** (up to \$1500 per year)
 - International student entering Canada on a student study permit
- 2) **Access Credit Union Scholarship** (\$300)
 - preference is given to a graduate of Westgate Mennonite Collegiate or Mennonite Brethren Collegiate Institute (however, graduates of all institutions are encouraged to apply)

Returning Student Scholarships:

- 1) **International Student Scholarship** (up to \$1500 per year)
 - international student currently studying on a student study permit
- 2) **Ivan Esau Leadership Scholarship** (\$1300 per year)
 - exceptional academic record
 - proven leadership qualities (please outline in essay)
 - to honour the intention of the donor to develop leaders in the Mennonite community, at least one scholarship will be awarded to an active member of a Mennonite church (however, all students are encouraged to apply).
If you are applying for this scholarship and are an active member of a Mennonite church, please write the name of the church here: _____
 - student must submit *two* letters of reference; at least one of these references must be from an MSC faculty member
- 3) **Margarita Esau Achievement Scholarship** (up to \$700 per year)
 - strong academic record
 - proven leadership qualities
- 4) **Dr. J.E. Isaac Scholarship** (up to \$1000)
 - awarded to students of MSC on the basis of academic merit
- 5) **Dr. Bernie and Marge Wiebe Scholarship** (\$300)
 - strong academic achievement
 - leadership in addressing conflict, inequality and poverty
- 6) **Isaac and Margaret Redekop Scholarship** (up to \$400)
 - strong academic record
 - proven leadership qualities

7) Gisela Saborowski Memorial Scholarship (\$1000)

- strong academic record
- completed, at minimum, 60 credit hours
- active involvement as a volunteer in community agencies

NOTE: To honour the intention of the donor, the award will be given to an individual who has overcome challenges in pursuit of his/her education (as outlined in essay).

8) Elizabeth Buckland Memorial Scholarship (\$1000)

- completed *International Development Studies* or *Introduction to Conflict Resolution Studies* with a minimum 'B' final grade AND declared a major in Conflict Resolution or International Development Studies.
- be of Indigenous Identity (self-declared on U of Winnipeg application) or Newcomer Canadian (from a developing country within the last 5 years).
- submit an essay of 500 words outlining proven leadership qualities.

NOTE: To honour the intention of the donor, the award will be given to an individual who identifies as Indigenous or Newcomer Canadian and recognizes the potential of education to overcome particular challenges.

9) Menno Simons College Student Association (MSCSA) Scholarship (up to \$500)

- be aligned with the values of the MSCSA, including principles of peace, justice, equality, social action, and community.
- be enrolled in a minimum of two *Conflict Resolution Studies* or *International Development Studies* courses in an academic year.

10) John & Nel Derksen Scholarship (\$1000)

- completed, at minimum, 6 credit hours in CRS or IDS
- be of indigenous identity (self-declared), newcomer Canadian (from a developing country within last 5 years), or international student (from a developing country)
- submit an essay of 500 words outlining proven leadership qualities and academic abilities

11) Suzanne St. Yves Amani Peace Prize (up to \$425)

- completed, at minimum, 30 credit hours AND declared a major in Conflict Resolution Studies
- demonstrated commitment to peacebuilding, locally or internationally
- provide a list of activities, training, and/or volunteerism that demonstrated peacebuilding experiences

NOTE: To honour the intention of the donor, preference will be given to adult learners, Indigenous students, students with disabilities, newcomers to Canada, people from war-affected regions, refugees, or students from Winnipeg's inner city neighbourhoods.
